### Summary of the Meeting

The Nottingham and Nottinghamshire Patient and Public Engagement Committee (PPEC) has continued to meet virtually on a monthly basis and most recently meetings have taken place on 29 June and 27 July 2021. PPEC members have valued the attendance of Dr. James Hopkinson and Rosa Waddingham at their meetings representing the Executive Team.

Community and voluntary sector representatives from each ICP area are now included in the PPEC membership, Jane Hildreth, Jules Sebelin and Carolyn Perry are fulfilling these roles.

Key agenda items considered by PPEC members during the above mentioned meetings have included;

- The development of community engagement for the Integrated Care System.
- Focus on the Mid Nottinghamshire ICP vision, objectives, associated breakthrough objectives and delivery of engagement through the Voluntary Sector Alliance contract for patient and public engagement. Key outcomes shared included recovery engagement seeking out insight from the most vulnerable, diabetes and learning disabilities engagement, end of life and musculo skeletal pathway development and support for the Covid Vaccination Programme.
- Update on impact of engagement to develop the Children and Young People's Emotional Wellbeing Early Support, Training and Consultation Service.
- Updates on Covid infection rates and details of ongoing plans to vaccinate anyone over the age of 18 years via the 'Big Weekend' and the opportunity to walk into any of the 9 vaccination centres currently administering the vaccination were shared with PPEC members.
- Communication and engagement undertaken in relation to Platform One Practice transition and mobilisation was reviewed by PPEC members. Recommendations arising from the Health Scrutiny Committee had led to the establishment of a Stakeholder Group chaired by Healthwatch who had supported a smoother transition for patients and delivered good communication resources.
- Plans for restoration of elective activity, planned care transformation consisting of 3 core workstreams; cancer, diagnostics and elective and out-patient transformation were shared with PPEC members.

### Key Messages for the Governing Body

The key messages that PPEC members agreed to share with the Governing Body from its meetings held on 29 June and 27 July 2021 are;

1. PPEC members welcomed the development of plans to support community engagement as part of

ICS transition and to their involvement in planned workshops to develop this further. PPEC members suggested reference to co-production should be included in the plans.

2. The Mid Nottinghamshire Voluntary Sector Alliance update was welcomed and the need to focus on areas of deprivation and ethnically diverse communities who may be isolated geographically due to lower prevalence was highlighted by PPEC members.
3. The children and young people engagement provided an excellent example of co-production in service transformation. Immediate improvements had also been achieved through provision of better communication resources.
4. Discussion regarding Platform One Practice transition had highlighted the need for earlier and better engagement in Primary Care Commissioning decisions working with local groups and networks who support the most vulnerable within our communities. A stronger link between PPEC and the Primary Care Commissioning Committee was also recommended.
5. Lewis Etoria was attending his final PPEC meeting prior to leaving the CCG. PPEC members thanked Lewis for his commitment to public engagement over the past 6 years and wished him well for the future.

The ratified minutes of Patient and Public Engagement Committee held on 29 July 2021 will be presented to the Governing Body on 06 October 2021.
